



Connie DiLeo

COPA – Community Partners, Inc. — is a Christian Mission founded in England and Florida which works in support of communities in the Dominican Republic. Since 1991, volunteers from the UK and the US, alongside the people from the local villages, have built two schools, two pre-schools, two dining shelters, and two kitchens. COPA has been able to pursue their mission of building Christian, caring communities by developing educational opportunities and providing health education in the Dominican Republic under the leadership of Rev. Connie DiLeo and COPA Dominican Republic leaders.

New Covenant and the Rev. Connie DiLeo have had a covenant relationship since 2004. Connie is a United Methodist missionary and spent the last 17 years in the Dominican Republic serving and helping with COPA. The students in the two COPA schools in poor villages receive Christmas shoe boxes every year from New Covenant. The first mission trip to the Dominican Republic was organized by George and Andrea Davidson, and joined by New Covenant founding Pastor Gary Bullock, his wife Cam, and 14 others. Since 2004, New Covenant has sponsored more than nine mission trips to Bombita and LaHoya. Since 2005, over 450 children of the Bombita and LaHoya schools have been sponsored by New Covenant congregants.

Connie is retiring from the Global Board of Missions in June. We welcome her and wish her well in the next phase of her life. Countless young lives have received an education and hope for their future because of her love and dedication to serving God and the people of Bombita and LaHoya!




PrimeTime — Everyone is Invited!
